Stewardship of Time, Talent, & Treasure

What return can I make to the Lord for all His kindness to me? (Psalm 116:12)

Stewardship is a phrase which merges the Biblical concept of tithing (giving 10%) of one's time and finances to God with current Catholic theology of generously living the Gospel teachings of Jesus. Stewardship is a way of life for the Christian disciple. We are simply the stewards – that is, the caretakers – of all that our generous and loving God has given us. This is the responsibility of all the baptized and a necessity for all parishioners. All members (except those in nursing homes or having serious health problems) are asked to actively give of their time, talents, and financial resources to build our parish community and help those in need.

Most important is your *TIME* spent in *PRAYER*. Whether in church, at home, in the workplace, in the classroom, in the car or on the field or court of competition, every moment we have in our lives is a gift from God so we must pray. It is vital that all families join their St. Ignatius Parish community for Sunday Mass here in our church as frequently as possible. Families seeing each other at Sunday Mass in their own church strengthens the spiritual bonds of our community and generates fellowship.

Your **TALENTS** shared through **INVOLVEMENT** in a parish ministry, activity or organization, fosters spiritual growth and nurtures fellowship. This directory is amazingly full of various opportunities where everyone can be involved in the life of the parish in one way or another. Your **TREASURE** in giving in our Sunday collection **SUPPORTS** the parish financially in a recordable way through the use of the Sunday contribution envelopes, checks, and/or on-line giving. You are encouraged to financially support the parish to the best of your ability.

Time spent in *PRAYER*, talent shared through *INVOLVEMENT*, and treasure given to *SUPPORT* the Sunday collection are three foundational witnesses our children need to see being practiced in their families and to grow in their Faith, to properly understand what it means to be "church" and to be poised to become active and effective adult members of the Church in the future.

Child Protection Decree

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati recognizes the need to address child abuse, and attempts to do so through the Decree on Child Protection. The purpose of the Decree is two-fold. It is intended to prevent the abuse of children and adolescents. Prevention can best be achieved by the education of children, clerics, employees, parents and volunteers about the realities of abuse. The second purpose of the Decree is to provide a system for handling incidents of abuse after they occur. The key elements of the system include a report to civil authorities, assessing the allegation, caring for the abused individual and his/her family, acting appropriately with regard to the accused person, and attending to the local church community.
