As you are probably aware, the students are very knowledgeable about how many days of school are left. At the beginning of each day, the children remind me, "Mr. Vance, do you know we only have 7 days of school left?" I must admit, the year has flown by for me as I was the "rookie" in the building. My year was similar to the students as I was experiencing all the new events and traditions of the school. It has been a wonderful time of learning and prayer.

At this time of the year, I like to take a quick minute and encourage all parents and students to read, read, read over the summer. One of the most important activities for students to do over the summer should be reading. Studies are showing that if students continue to read consistently over the summer, the "summer slide," a decline in reading ability and other academic abilities due to summer vacation, is diminished or eliminated altogether. Please join the staff and me in encouraging or mandating reading for all students over the summer.

Have a blessed Memorial Day weekend! In Christ's Peace, Kevin Vance, Principal 4 Facts to Know About Summer Reading:

1. *All it Takes is Four*. By reading four or more books over the summer, kids can avoid the infamous "summer slide" or what we know as the gap in academic skills when returning to school in the fall.

2. Let Them Choose. Research indicates that young people are 91% more likely to finish books they choose themselves. Sometimes, the latest Newberry award winner may move them, or they may be more interested in the classics from a generation or two ago.

3. *Top of the Tests*: Kids who read a million words a year score in the top 2% on standardized tests. A million words may sound like an overwhelming amount, but it's only about 25 average-length novels.

4. *Big Vocabularies.* Kids learn 4,000-12,000 new words every year by reading books, which means that 3 months without books can make a huge difference in test scores and vocabularies.

5. *Take the Accelerated Reader Quiz* over the books read at our school AR website. This provides the staff with information that can be used in the fall. <u>https://hosted304.renlearn.com/113046/</u>
