Dear Parents and Guardians,

The school leadership team has been meeting to plan for the future and to address concerns of staff and parents. I ask for your prayers, support, and patience as we navigate the next three weeks of instruction, virtual learning, community building, and prayer. As announced last week, Saint Ignatius School will continue the educational process through the implementation of virtual learning beginning Monday, March 16. While the school building is closed, learning continues in a different form and mode.

Over the next few days, students will be exposed to various ways to communicate, complete their classwork, take tests and quizzes, research, and collaborate. They may begin to use crucial 21st-century skills and practices that have been employed in the business world for many years, like video conferencing. The teachers are working diligently to provide engaging lessons that are not overwhelming for the students and their parents.

A few announcements:

1. If your child needs a laptop/ipad to use as we implement virtual learning, you must contact our technology coordinator, Ms. Karis Bowman, at <u>kbowman@saintischool.org</u>. She will set up the device for your child and prepare the waiver that must be completed by the parent. Ms. Bowman will be available on Monday, March 16 and Tuesday, March 17 between the hours of 9 am – 3 pm. As stated, please contact before showing up at school to pick up the device.

2. If Covid 19 affects your family, we ask that you contact our school nurse, Mrs. Kathy Reder. Please let her know if someone in your family has tested positive or that they have been quarantined due to an exposure to the virus. This information will be used to help us track how prevalent it is in our community and to plan for the future of your child's education. You can contact her by email at kreder@saintischool.org.
